### Pentecost Sunday: 19 May 2024

#### This is the feast of Pentecost. It is the birthday of the Church. Pentecost was a harvest festival for Jews, probably still is. The apostles and disciples were gathered in one room when the Spirit of God came on them like a powerful wind from Heaven. Something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire. These separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2)

Things were never going to be the same for them again. As a result of the coming of the spirit, they went into the streets of Jerusalem preaching the good news of the message of Jesus of Nazareth. They were no longer afraid. Devout Jews from many nations who were gathered in Jerusalem for the feast of Pentecost heard them preaching in their own language. *How is it,* they said, *all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language.* (Acts 2) It was an extraordinary outpouring of the spirit.

Under the influence of the spirit, the apostles were to leave their homes and families and fishing to preach the message of Jesus of Nazareth all over the Roman Empire. Thomas according to tradition went to India. Philip went to Spain; Peter and Paul went to Rome. Nearly all of them were martyred as witnesses to their faith in Jesus of Nazareth, and his message. All that travelling and preaching began on Pentecost Sunday with the coming of the Spirit.

There is no blue print for the coming of the Spirit, except they were all gathered together. The Spirit of God comes in the most surprising ways and in the most unexpected circumstances. We cannot earn the coming of the Spirit. We cannot force the Spirit's coming. The Spirit comes when the spirit comes.

Patrick Kavanagh, the poet said in the poem Having Confessed:

We must not daydream to-morrow's judgment— God must be allowed to surprise us.

#### FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors

from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike -Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

#### SECOND READING

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to selfindulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication. gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and guarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desires. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit. The word of the Lord.
