## St Peter's Parish - 50 Years

Fifty years ago (1974) St Peter's became the parish Church of the newly established parish of Phibsboro. Fr Tommy Fagan CM was the first parish priest as the Vincentians took on pastoral care of the area, extending the ministry of St Peter's which until then was a centre from which parish missions were conducted throughout Ireland and foreign missions were also supported.

Much has changed in Ireland, the Church and in Phibsboro over the course of half a century. The people of Phibsboro and surrounding areas worked tirelessly with the Vincentians to build up a strong faith filled community: the Eucharist and celebration of the Sacraments have been the strong beating heart of parish life while thriving sodalities (Sacred Heart, Children of Mary, Children's Sodality) enlivened a sense of the living Faith. The parish and the Vincentian Community took seriously the call of Vatican II to be a missionary Church supporting a recently established mission to Nigeria, the ministry to people who are deaf, the Travelling People, refugees, people who were homeless. The vocation of laypeople came increasingly to the fore with local conferences of the St Vincent de Paul, praesidia of the Legion of Mary, and the Ladies of Charity all thriving in the parish. More recently Vincentian Lay Missionaries and the Association of the Miraculous Medal have grown in strength.

The Vincentians and the parish have not always done all things well. Lessons have, hopefully, been learned over the years. As we mark a jubilee of parish life the Irish Church faces many challenges and we as well. The charisms of our Founders St Vincent de Paul, Louise de Marillac, Frederic Ozanam blend faith and humility with the boldness of charity for the service of Jesus in His people with simplicity, sincerity and singlemindedness. These charisms are as precious in today's Phibsboro as they were in Vincent de Paul's Paris. We thank God for all we have received and been blessed with as a parish community and as we mark a milestone we pray that the grace of God will bless us still, to be true disciples of the will of God today and in the years to come.

## GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture: This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations. You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.' He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'
