SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY...

... is transferred from Sunday 8th to Monday 9th December. It is a holyday of obligation: Mass times 10.30am and 7.00pm (Novena included).

ENCOURAGEMENT AND HOPE - IN ADVENT TIME

A natural observation

In human life it can happen that persons, whole societies may have expectation, and special joy at some unfolding in reality. This could occur around a General Election, a big victory in sport, a new Pope.

Then

In Reading 1 (Baruch 5) there is a most desirable picture of joyful living after slavery. The text is ostensibly set in post-Exile (c.520 BC). Still, Baruch is historically linked with Jeremiah (c.580 BC). The text for today is most probably from the Hellenistic age (in the E Mediterranean world from Alexander (c.330 BC) to the time of Christ). In Reading 2 St Paul, writing to his early Catholics in Philippi, calls them to "a pure and blameless life", in strong hope of eternal glory. In the Gospel John offers a great prospect of hope as he prepares for Christ's ministry.

Now

Personal and communal wellbeing on a natural level, while valid and desirable, when rightly understood, yet lack the spiritual dimension. Lately, a young person possessing many satisfactions yet spoke of being spiritually empty. Bishop McKeown has recently referred to this possibility. Peace, joy, and meaning come from following God's design. We give our spirit a chance! We take time of reflection, joining Mary, Joseph - and Jesus on the road from Nazareth to Bethlehem.

The remembrance of Christ's coming teaches us to share in, to lay hold of the grace (of this season) by faith and sacraments.

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of the Prophet Baruch

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever,

wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head:

since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, the name God gives you for ever will be.

'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'.

Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them.

Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in

For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God.

And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.
